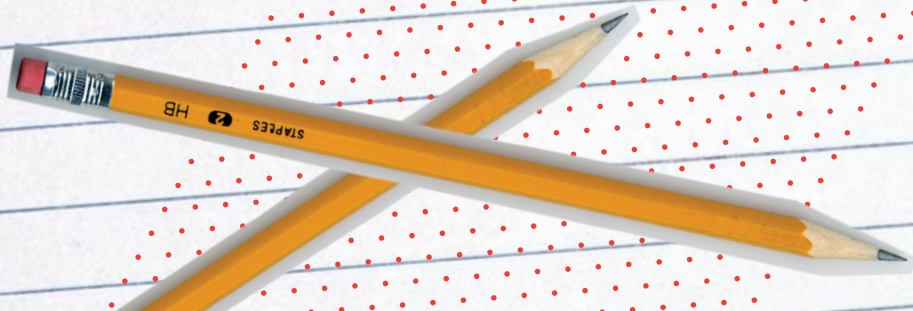

63% of K-8th grade students City Year Milwaukee AmeriCorps members worked with saw an increase in their **math** STAR test scores



60% of K-8th grade students City Year Milwaukee AmeriCorps members worked with in **English Language Arts** saw an increase in their ELA STAR test scores



93% of the high school students that City Year Milwaukee AmeriCorps members worked were promoted to 10th grade.
